


TENNESSEE IS THE ONLY STATE TO REQUIRE ABSENTEE BALLOTS BE RECEIVED BY MAIL BY THE CLOSE OF POLLS ON ELECTION DAY

Tennesseans voting absentee must return their ballots **by mail**, and the ballots must be received by the close of polls on Election Day. However, voters may request an absentee ballot up to **seven days before Election Day**, meaning a properly requested absentee ballot may not be counted because it does not arrive in time.

Lawmakers could consider policies to address this situation so that all eligible Tennesseans are able to have their vote count.



Enhancing, rather than removing, opportunities for voters to participate supports increased civic engagement.

Keep the current application deadline of seven days before Election Day.

Maintaining the current window keeps Tennessee aligned with the majority of states.

Allow voters to return absentee ballots directly to election officials.

Ballots returned in person could be stored in the same way as those received currently. This would simply allow not just mail carriers but individual voters (or their designee) to give them to election officials.

North Dakota's deadline is "in a timely manner to allow time to vote."N.D.C.C § 16.1-07-05(3). Mississippi Code says absentee applications and ballots must be postmarked on or before Election Day. Mississippi Code Title 23. Elections § 23-15-637(1)(a).
